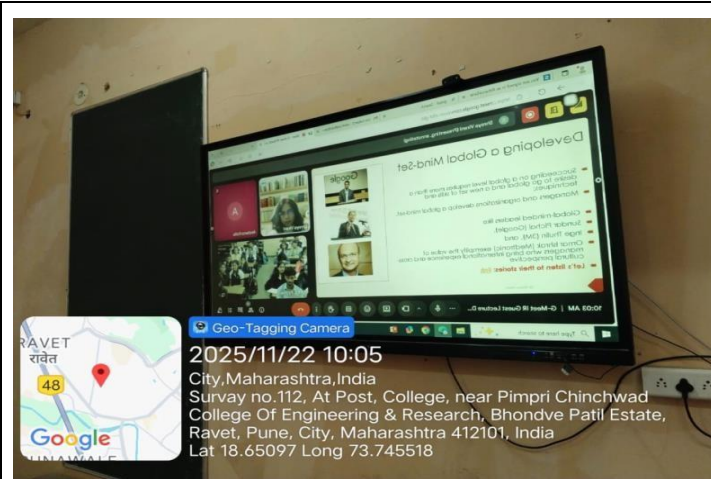

One of the most engaging parts of the session was her insightful discussion on **future bosslessness companies**. She described how many modern organizations are shifting towards flatter structures with no traditional bosses. In such models, decisions are made collectively, responsibilities are shared, and employees experience greater autonomy, resulting in enhanced creativity and flexibility.

During the interactive segment, a student raised an important question: “*How can bosslessness companies work if there is no boss to manage the tasks?*” Dr. Virani explained that these organizations function through **self-managed teams** supported by clear role definitions, transparent communication, and collaborative digital tools. She clarified that although there is no single authority figure, leadership becomes shared, accountability increases, and teams operate effectively through mutual trust and common goals.

In conclusion, Dr. Virani encouraged students to strengthen their **adaptability**, **communication skills**, **leadership mindset**, and **technological competencies** to thrive in the rapidly evolving business world. The session was highly informative, interactive, and enriching, providing students with valuable insights into the future of management practices.
